Bike Program Assistant

Position Overview

Duke Farms' Bike Rental Program is one of our most popular amenities, as biking is a healthy, environmentally friendly, and fun way to experience the extent of our sizeable campus. As such, the area around the Bike Tent can quickly become crowded; visitors not only expect to be able to rent a bicycle but also are typically seeking directions and answers to various questions. The Bike Program Assistant supports Duke Farms staff with all aspects of the process, from dispensing bicycles and helmets to engaging with visitors.

Responsibilities

The Bike Program Assistant...

- Helps Duke Farms staff distribute, collect, and clean bicycles and helmets.
- If there is a line of visitors waiting to rent bicycles, ensures it remains orderly.
- May be asked to answer basic questions about Duke Farms and provide directions to points of interest.

Schedule

The shifts for this position are 10 AM to 12 PM and 12 PM to 2 PM every Saturday, May through October.

- Shifts are not guaranteed for every volunteer interested in this position. Instead, available shifts are offered to all Bike Program Assistants on a first come, first serve basis.
- Volunteers scheduled on Saturdays do not need to reserve parking passes.

Expectations

The Bike Program Assistant is expected to...

- Be punctual, approachable, and friendly.
- Be physically able to...
 - Work in weather conditions ranging from hot and sunny to cool and overcast.
 - Travel about 1 mile on a flat, paved surface.
 - Propel bicycles of varying sizes/designs across a flat, paved surface.
- Be comfortable communicating extensively with the public.
- Be comfortable working independently, in a pairing, or in a group.
- Be able to effectively communicate and coordinate with other volunteers and Duke Farms staff.

- Regularly submit time spent volunteering to Volgistics, the program Duke Farms uses to manage its volunteer community.

Education Assistant

Position Overview

Over 150,000 people visit Duke Farms each year, many of whom seek to learn – about Duke Farms, the natural wonders of our region, important environmental issues and advancements, and more. Environmental education is foundational to Duke Farms’ mission, enabling us to maximize our impact through meaningful connections with engaged learners of all ages and backgrounds. The Education Assistant plays a vital role in forging these connections, aiding staff with creative and interactive activities and programs exploring a wide variety of environmental topics.

Responsibilities

The Education Assistant...

- Engages with visitors by way of discovery-based learning opportunities – for example, native wildflower walks and insect netting excursions – offered at varying, strategically selected locations across the campus.
- Provides interpretation for visitors at the Education Trailer, a large mobile unit containing informative displays, tangible materials such as feathers and bones, field guides, and microscopes.
- Accompanies instructors during classes to offer general support. For example, they may conduct the check-in process, aid with set-up and break-down (ex. arrange folding chairs and tables), and/or distribute material.
- Photographs programming in progress, to be shared with Duke Farms’ Communications Manager.
- May be asked to answer basic questions about Duke Farms and provide directions to points of interest.

Schedule

For discovery-based learning opportunities: Shifts are typically available every Saturday, morning and afternoon, April through October. Each shift is 2 to 3 hours.

For classes: Shifts are announced as programming is scheduled.

- Volunteers scheduled on Saturdays do not need to reserve parking passes.

Expectations

- Be physically able to...
 - Work in weather conditions ranging from hot and sunny to cool and overcast.
 - Travel long distances (1-3 miles) on flat to uneven, paved and unpaved surfaces, potentially uphill.
- Be comfortable communicating extensively with the public.
- Be comfortable working independently, in a pairing, or in a group.
- Be able to effectively communicate and coordinate with other volunteers and Duke Farms staff.
- Regularly submit time spent volunteering to Volgistics, the program Duke Farms uses to manage its volunteer community.

Support

The Education Assistant will have access to informational resources. The general themes of the discovery-based learning opportunities are chosen by Duke Farms staff; if a certain level of knowledge about a theme is required, informational resources will be shared prior to the start of the shift. They will also be required to participate in quarterly trainings, provided by Duke Farms staff, on effective communication techniques, best practices in education, and organizational procedures.

M&M Crew - Central

Position Overview

Responsibilities

The Monitor-and-Maintain Crew Member (Central)...

- Assists staff with the upkeep of the landscaping and paths of, and habitat immediately surrounding, the Old Foundation, Orchid Range, and Pollinator Garden, weeding and mulching beds, trimming overgrowth, and removing invasive plants and installing native plants as needed.
- Places signage identifying flowers in bloom in the Pollinator Garden.

IMPORTANT NOTE: This position is not involved with the care of the specimens inside of the Orchid Range. That is a specialized position that requires prior experience and/or training by Duke Farms staff.

Pathfinder

Position Overview

At over 1,000 acres, and with more than 15 miles of trail, the Core – the area of Duke Farms open to the public – is beautiful, wondrous...and a bit overwhelming. Its landmarks are widely scattered, its paths crisscross, and its habitats can resemble one another; even when equipped with a map, the average visitor can quickly become disoriented. The Pathfinder is the public's liaison to Duke Farms, an intrepid explorer who is familiar enough with both the land and the organization to provide directions and answer questions.

Responsibilities

The Pathfinder...

- Traverses Duke Farms as an obvious representative of the organization, greeting, orienting, and answering questions for visitors.

Schedule

Morning, afternoon, and evening shifts are available every day except Sunday and Monday, April through October.

- Shifts are not guaranteed for every volunteer interested in this position. Instead, available shifts are offered to all Pathfinders on a first come, first serve basis.
- Volunteers scheduled on Saturdays do not need to reserve parking passes.

Expectations

*** A background check is required for this position and will be administered by the Duke Farms' People and Culture Team through a third-party company prior to the volunteer's start date.**

Stewardship Volunteer – POSITION CLOSED

Position Overview

Duke Farms is a 2,700-acre oasis in an otherwise heavily fragmented and degraded landscape matrix. It serves as safe and healthy habitat for New Jersey's native flora and fauna while also providing transformative experiences for everyone from the average visitor to leaders in environmental fields. The ecological integrity of this place is ensured by facilities like the eight-foot deer fence that surrounds the entirety of the Core; the year-round hard work of, particularly, our Natural Resources and Designed Landscapes staff; and the dedication of our Stewardship Volunteers, who support Duke Farms as we strive to restore nature and ecosystem services in our region.

Responsibilities

The Stewardship Volunteer...

- Assists Duke Farms staff with generally caring for the land by, for example, maintaining trails, clearing fences, removing invasive plants, installing native plants, and clearing storm damage debris.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The Stewardship Volunteer's worksite changes often and may be in areas of the campus closed to the public.

Schedule

The shift* for this position is 8:30 AM to 11:30 AM every Monday, May through October.

Visitor Services Assistant

Position Overview

Over 150,000 people visit Duke Farms every year, almost all of whom come with an array of questions: What is Duke Farms? Where is the Bike Tent, the Orchid Range? How about the restrooms, or the bald eagle nest? Is the Café open today? What activities are there to do? They seek answers – and maps, brochures, educational resources, and more – at the Orientation Center of the Farm Barn, our main hub. The Visitor Services Assistant is the friendly face of Duke Farms; they support the Front Desk staff members as they administer to visitor needs by welcoming people as they arrive, providing directions, and answering basic questions.

Responsibilities

The Visitor Services Assistant...

- Acts as an obvious representative of the organization in the Orientation Center of the Farm Barn, greeting, orienting, and answering questions for visitors.

Schedule

The shift for this position is 11 AM to 2 PM every Saturday, May through October.

The Visitor Services Assistant will have access to basic information about Duke Farms to answer frequently-asked questions. They will also be able to consult or redirect visitors to Duke Farms staff members at the Front Desk as needed.
